BIOSECURITY

Guidelines for importers of Timber

These guidelines accompany the Import Health Standard for the Importation of <u>TIMBER</u> into Ascension Island.

Timber products that appear clean may harbour pests which are very difficult to detect in their egg or larval stage. They therefore pose a biosecurity risk which these standards are designed to minimise.

- You **do not** require an import licence to import timber into Ascension.
- However, all consignments must meet specified import health standards.
- Timber should be treated as stated in the import health standard, as close to the shipping day as possible.
- Any packaging with the consignment must be clean and new.
- It is your responsibility to make sure the supplier or packer has a copy of the import health standard and understands that consignments of timber must meet these conditions.
- It is your responsibility to ensure the consignments are free of live insects, seeds and other contaminants prior to arrival in Ascension.
- On arrival the consignment may be inspected by a Biosecurity Officer.
- If the consignment does not meet the requirements of the import health standard, it may either be reconsigned or destroyed at the importer's expense.
