About the role

The Police Inspector will lead a small team of police officers to improve the lives of all within the community of Ascension Island, and help Ascension thrive by delivering and developing the operational capability and capacity of the Royal St. Helena Police Service. You will be an employee of the Royal St Helena Police Service on deployment to Ascension Island for the period of the contract.

What you'll do

As the Police Inspector of Ascension Island, you will be responsible for the management of all aspects of day-to-day policing on the island including planning, management and command of Police Operations. No two days will be the same in this role, as your carry out day-to-day policing on the island of Ascension, you will also undertake the role as Emergency Planning Officer, Superintendent of Prisons in accordance with the prisons ordinance, Chief Immigration Officer, Licensing Officer and you will supervise and advise on the register of vehicles with the post office staff, driver examiners and motor vehicle examiners. Other role responsibilities are outlined in the attached Job Profile.

What you'll bring

You'll be qualified to Inspector accredited PIP1 trained or equivalent (or higher) and have a broad policing experience in a variety of operational environments including (but not exclusively) experience of neighborhood policing, Response Policing, Crime Investigation experience and experience of working in partnership with external stakeholders. You'll have effective IT, administrative and organizational skills along with the ability to adapt to new situations and environments. You'll be able to identify cause and effect and develop a course of action, drawing on evidence base, designed to target root causes, mitigate risk and manage impact.
