

## Major Work Underway at Georgetown Waste Water Plant Site

Project update

Following a period of preparation works, major works have started on the site of the new Georgetown Waste Water Works site.

The site of the works is opposite Long Beach and has been chosen in close cooperation with the Conservation & Fisheries Directorate, who have also kindly assisted with advice on the right type of fencing to avoid Turtles entering the work area as well as how to carry out the works in ways that do not disrupt the adjacent beach.

The new plant, which is being built just across the road from the current site, is a closed system in separate units which will operate much more efficiently and produce higher quality effluent water.

Meanwhile the new Waste Water plant at Two Boats is nearing completion with the final assembly phase starting after several months of challenging ground and civil works. The Two Boats plant is expected to be finished in April and the Georgetown plant in July.

The need to replace the Georgetown and Two Boats waste water plants was identified in 2017 and the replacement of both has been enabled thanks to joint funding from AIG and the UK government, through CSSF and FCDO International Programme.
