Information for vessels visiting Ascension Island

Information on Anchoring

- All yachts must anchor; mooring buoys are not available for visiting vessels.
- Please anchor between the mooring buoy field and floating pipeline in Clarence Bay (Georgetown) around position 7°55.2'S, 014°24.7'W.

On Arrival

- Landing is only permitted at the pier head steps. Dinghies must tie on to one of the moorings adjacent to the landing steps and not the landing steps themselves.
- At the earliest opportunity, the yacht's Master must contact the Harbour Master on VHF Channel 16 to agree a time to come ashore to register the vessel, carry out port formalities and immigration procedures.
- Yachts arriving after 16:00 and over the weekend must report their arrival to Ascension Island Radio on VHF Channel 16.
- No crew members are allowed ashore unless authorised by Port Control.
- All visitors MUST have an approved e-visa prior to arrival at Ascension.

Information on Biosecurity

- Ascension Island is very remote and its unique ecosystems are therefore highly vulnerable to new and invasive species arriving via visiting vessels.
- The master of an incoming vessel must take all reasonable steps to ensure that no:
 - waste containing any animal, plant, animal product or plant product;
 - o bilge water, sewage or foul wastewater;
 - o ballast,

is discharged from the vessel into the sea whilst the vessel is in Ascension.

- Controlled items (live animals, plant material, fresh produce, compost/peat/soil, and natural packing material) may only be landed with a licence or prior permission.
- Please check all your equipment, including shoes, bags, hiking, fishing, or sports gear, as well as ropes, anchors, chains, and fishing lines, to ensure they are clean from mud, soil, weed seeds, or biofouling organisms before arriving in Ascension.
- Please be aware that during your stay, your vessel may be subject to a biosecurity hull inspection, which will involve a camera survey from a small boat.
- Please ensure that your hull is clean before departing for Ascension Island. Do not clean your hull within the waters of Ascension Island Marine Protected Area under any circumstances.
